



TRAINING:

Ammonia Emergency Response Certification Training

Government regulations require that plant Safety Directors and personnel who respond to spills or leaks in ammonia systems, must have specific training. OSHA Regulation 1910.120 requires 24 hours of Emergency Response Training for personnel who will plug, patch, or stop the leak.

Gartner Refrigeration, in cooperation with Industrial Consultants, holds four training classes twice a year that will enable your employees to obtain their ERT 24-hour certification, or an 8-hour refresher to maintain the certification.

The 24 hour training includes classroom time, instructions on proper use of equipment, as well as a simulated emergency using gas masks, self-contained breathing apparatus, and a totally encapsulated suit.

At the end of the class an examination is given, by an OSHA Certified Instructor, and certificates showing that OSHA Training Requirements have been met are awarded.
